



Cape Breton Regional Library Now Offers eBooks and Audiobooks Through its OverDrive Digital Media Download Service

OverDrive®

OverDrive is a service that lets library patrons download and enjoy eBooks and audiobooks. *There are no overdue fines with digital books because they automatically expire on their due date.* To get started with OverDrive, all you need is your CBRL library card and access to the internet.

eBooks are offered in Adobe PDF and Adobe EPUB formats. They can be viewed on most computers, as well as several popular eBook readers, such as the Kobo and the Sony Reader.

Digital Audiobooks are offered in MP3 and WMA (Windows Media Audio) formats. They can be listened to on most computers and most mp3 players and compatible devices.

To use eBooks and/or audiobooks, you must download and install free software from the Digital Media Downloads/OverDrive website.

How to Experience OverDrive

From Home: You can download and view both eBooks and Audiobooks from home, or using a wireless connection with your laptop or wireless device. First, you will have to download and install software from the Digital Media Downloads/OverDrive website. There are instructions on how to do this in the Quick Start Guide on the following page.

From the Library: Due to copyright issues, at this time you are only able to download audiobooks from library computers. To do so, simply bring in your audio device (e.g. a compatible mp3 player or ipod), register for a library computer and connect your device to the computer. Go to the Digital Media/OverDrive website and follow the steps to browse, checkout and download an audiobook as outlined in the Quick Start Guide. You do not need to download any software to use OverDrive in the library.

First Time Using OverDrive: Quick Start Guide

Step 1: Download free software

Go to the Digital Media Downloads/OverDrive website from the library website at <http://www.cbri.ca/Overdrive/OverDriveResources.asp>. Scroll down and click the green sign in/enter button. Then look on the right-hand side of the page under the heading *Digital Software* and download and install the necessary software.

-If you want to read eBooks on your personal computer **or** if you have an eReader device (e.g. Kobo eReader, Kobo Touch, or Sony Reader), download and install [Adobe Digital Editions](#) on your computer.

- If you want to listen to audiobooks on your computer or iPod/mp3 player **or** if you want to access eBooks and/or audiobooks using a tablet device* (e.g. Kobo Vox or iPad) download and install [OverDrive Media Console](#).

**Download the OverDrive Media Console application directly to your tablet device.*

Step 2: Authorize and update your software

-You will be prompted to activate your eBook software using an Adobe ID. Follow the steps to create an Adobe ID if you do not already have one.

-You may need to download a Windows Media Player security update to use *OverDrive Media Console*.

Step 3: Sign In and browse or search for eBooks and audiobooks

-On the Digital Media Downloads/OverDrive website (www.cbri.ca/Overdrive/OverdriveResources.asp), click the green sign in/enter button and sign in using your library card barcode (the number on the back of your library card with no spaces) and PIN (the last four digits of the phone number you provided when you registered for a library card).

-Browse or search the OverDrive website for the eBooks and/or audiobooks you want!

Step 4: Check out, download and enjoy!

-You may have up to ten eBooks and/or audiobooks checked out at any given time. For most items, you can select the loan period that works best for you: either 1, 2 or 3 weeks!
