Purpose

The subject of Genealogy is becoming more popular as people are increasingly interested in finding their roots and tracing their family tree. The Cape Breton Regional Library is an excellent resource for genealogical information, but the information on this topic is spread throughout various parts of the library. The purpose of this subject guide is to assist patrons in starting their research by locating information on genealogy from the variety of resources available.

Scope

The information needs of individuals embarking on genealogical research can be diverse. This guide is focussed on the beginning stages of genealogical research. Please remember that further materials on the history of Cape Breton and Nova Scotia are also available from the Cape Breton Regional Library.
